The consumption of psychoactive substances and behavioral addictions generate research in different areas, therefore, an issue like this is not addressed from a single discipline but covers interdisciplinary questions that nurture both the prevention and treatment of addictions.

Volume 4 number 2 of the journal Drugs and Addictive Behavior contains a diversity of topics that can be addressed and the need to involve more areas for the analysis of the complexity involved in a substance use disorder in humans.

In this new edition, seven (7) research articles and two (2) theoretical review articles are presented, which account for a range of studies related to addictions not only to substances, but also to behaviors.

To begin, the master Dubis Marcela Rincón Barreto invites us to reflect on body dysmorphic disorder and its implications at a time when the body and fitness culture take on so much relevance.

The seven research articles raise, from the parents' position regarding alcohol consumption, the stigma that health professionals present to consumers, the addictive behaviors associated with video games, the position against sex and addictions of people with functional diversity, violence between parents and children associated with consumption and prevention strategies implemented in educational contexts. The variety of topics allows the reader to choose their areas of deepening and broadens the view of the association of addictions with different areas.

To close the number, two theoretical review articles are presented: the first focuses on the use of informed consent when it comes to treatment, and the second shows the trajectory of the issue of harm reduction in the Latin American context.

With these new articles we hope to contribute to the new knowledge that is developed in the area and motivate our readers and researchers to generate new research proposals.
